Adult Education & Literacy Program provides services in:

- *Basic Education Skills* for adults who need to work on improving basic reading, writing and math skills.
- *GED preparation* for adults who wish to work on passing the GED test.
- *Workplace skills*
- *ACT preparation* for adults who are required to take the ACT test prior to pursuing post-secondary education.
- *English as a Second Language* for non-English speaking adults who wish to improve their language skills needed to succeed in other educational/training programs and to cope more effectively with the challenges of their daily lives.

Head Start will reimburse childcare expenses to any parent or guardian with a child currently enrolled in the Green Hills Head Start program while they are taking GED preparation classes. We reimburse \$1.50 an hour per child during the hours of the GED class. A [reimbursement form](#) will be provided to verify classroom attendance and information pertaining to childcare.

Head Start will reimburse mileage to any parent or guardian with a child currently enrolled in the Green Hills Head Start program while they are taking GED preparation classes. The current reimbursement rate for mileage to/from the class site is 55.5¢/mile. Mileage is recorded on the same form as the childcare and classroom information.

Head Start will pay the GED application and test fees for any parent or guardian with a child currently enrolled in the Green Hills Head Start program. When the instructor feels the student is ready for the GED test, an application for the GED test is completed. This application and any other necessary forms are mailed to Shelia Williams at Green Hills Head Start, 205 West 18th Street, Trenton, MO 64683. The \$20 application fee will be placed with the paperwork and sent on to Jefferson City. Once the parent/guardian receives the authorization notice back from the state, they notify Kadi Gamble to secure the \$20 required test fee.

GED Internet Alternative

If you can't make it to class, the GED Online Class course is perfect for you. All you have to do is go to a local Adult Education and Literacy class once every 90 days to enroll and remain online.

GED Merit Scholarships at NCMC

This scholarship is awarded for outstanding performance on the GED examination. Qualified students must score at least 2900 on the GED examination, be first-time entering college students, and enroll in at least 6 credit hours. The award is for tuition up to \$500 per semester and is renewable for three semesters with continuous enrollment and a 3.0 minimum grade point average.

Elizabeth M. Barton GED Scholarships

This scholarship is awarded to GED students not meeting the GED Merit requirements and is granted for one or two semesters. The award of \$250 per semester is for tuition and may be increased for full-time students.

Elizabeth M. Barton Explore College Scholarships

are available to non-traditional, first-time college students 23 years of age and older. This award may pay for tuition/fees up to 6 credit hours and \$75 toward textbooks. The applicant must first apply for a Federal Pell Grant before the award is finalized. If the applicant qualifies for a Pell Grant, the Explore College Scholarship will be reduced or removed accordingly.

Diversity Scholarships provide access to education for under-represented populations and cultural groups at NCMC. This award covers tuition and is renewable for students who maintain a minimum 2.0 grade point average. Recipient must be a U. S. citizen.
